Kindergarten in Allen ISD

- First and foremost, Allen ISD teachers want to love and protect your children. Safety is our number one priority!
- In addition to providing age appropriate curriculum, our teachers are dedicated to nurturing and appreciating each student while fostering classroom connections.
- Teachers will focus on building relationships, classroom routines and procedures, and helping grow developmental characteristics at the beginning of the year. As the year progresses you will see an increase in challenging curriculum.

Developmental Characteristics

- **Emotional:** needs to feel secure, separates easily from caregiver, becomes more self-aware, develops self-control, expresses needs and wants
- **Intellectual:** is often highly imaginative, wants to learn new skills, listens and speaks at appropriate times, learns best by doing
- **Physical:** has high energy but tires easily, develops longer attention span, has better gross than fine motor skills, cares for self and belongings, catches colds or other communicable illnesses easily
- **Social:** enjoys new experiences, seeks friends, shares and works with others

Typical School Day

- Morning Announcements
- English/Language Arts (Word Work, Reading, and Writing)
- Math
- Social Studies
- Science
- Specials (Art, Music, P.E.)
- Centers
- Lunch and Recess
- Pack Up and Reflection



Additional School Day Information

- **Elementary School Day: 7:45 AM - 2:55 PM**
- **Snack:** Send a healthy snack in a container your child can open.
- **Lunch:** You can choose to send lunch with your child or have them buy lunch in the cafeteria. Menus are posted on the school and district websites. You will receive information via email before the start of the school year with instructions on how to load their account with money.
- **Car Riders/Walkers:** You will be given a card to hang from the mirror in your car or carry to show the staff when you pick your child up after school.

Additional Information

- **Buses:** Click on the [Find My Bus](#) link to see if your place of residence qualifies for bus transportation. Bus routes will be updated prior to the first day of school.
- **On the FIRST day, parents may walk students to the classroom. After the first day, students will enter the school on their own.**
- **Visitor Procedures:** Before entering the school, you will need to ring the doorbell, show identification, and briefly explain the purpose of your visit.

How Can I Help Prepare My Child For Kindergarten

- Have your child practice:
 - getting dressed
 - zipping and buttoning clothes/jackets
 - tying, buckling, or velcroing shoes
 - opening, packing, and closing a backpack
 - opening snack/lunch containers and water bottle
 - taking care of all restroom needs
- Starting a couple weeks before the first day of school, practice a morning and nighttime routine with your child.



How Can I Help Prepare My Child For Kindergarten cont.

- Have your child practice:
 - recognizing and writing their first name
 - recognizing and naming some letters of the alphabet
 - counting and recognizing some numbers
 - identifying basic shapes and colors
 - following directions
 - beginning and ending tasks at the appropriate time
 - clearly communicating their wants and needs
 - cleaning up their workspace and putting materials away
